

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

February 3, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of February with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

The minutes of the regular meetings held Jan. 6 - 8 - 11 - 15 were read and approved.

Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

A petition signed by Robert C. Rankin, Mayor of the City of Lawrence, and attested by the Clerk of the City of Lawrence, asking that the corporate limit of said city of Lawrence be extended to embrace certain unplatted territory adjacent thereto and fully described in said petition. The Board authorized the necessary publication and fixed March 10, 1930 at 1:30 o'clock P.M. and the office of the Board of County Commissioners in Lawrence, Kansas, as the time and place of hearing on said petition.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by E. J. Hill the following order of the Board of County Commissioners was unanimously adopted.

at a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, held on Feb 3, 1930, it was ordered that the County Clerk instruct the County Treasurer as follows: That fifty 50% per cent of the tax levied to pay National Bank judgments be distributed to the Lawrence National Bank, The Merchants National Bank and the Watkins National Bank in proportion to the amount their respective judgments bear to the total judgment. Provided: No distribution shall be made until each taxing district liable on this judgment has paid into the County treasury the taxes collected for this purpose.

February 5, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register. No other business of record was transacted.

February 8, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board finished the following claims against the county for the month of January.

The petition for the vacation of the following described road in Willow Springs Township, to-wit: Beginning at a point where U. S. Highway 73W intersects the North line of the Southeast quarter of Sec. 2; T 14S; R 19 E; thence east along the North line of said Southeast quarter section line to where the road turns in a northerly direction along west side of creek, and continuing in same northerly direction to a point in the present road fifty feet south of the west end of concrete bridge, known as the Boehle Bridge, across creek, was denied by the Board for the reason that the present road is a necessary travelled road.

The petition of Felix Tuckel and others for the location of a road described as follows: Beginning at the Northeast corner of the South half of the Southeast quarter of section 2 - 14 - 19, a point in the present established Township road, thence due west along the north line of said south half of Southeast quarter until it intersects with the U. S. Highway 73W, the point of ending, was denied for the reason that said route is impracticable and of no specific benefit to the public.

In the matter of viewing the road petitioned for by M. A. Childs and others in Marion Township, the Viewers find as follows:

We, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, acting as viewers of a road petitioned for by M. A. Childs and others in Marion Township, met at the point of beginning of said petitioned road on the February 7, 1930, and proceeded to view said route, or as near as we consider practical, and we recommend as follows: That a public road be laid out and established as follows: Beginning at a point where the Lone Star County Road intersects with the west line of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 2, - 14 - 18; thence North along the  $\frac{1}{4}$  line to the NW corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 1, then in a Northwesterly direction to the property owned by the Lone Star and Gun Club in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 36-13 -18, the point of ending.

We further recommend that the road be forty feet wide and that damaged to property owners be allowed as follows: To Roy Flory, for land and all other damages, the sum of \$400; to W. F. Smith, for land and all other damages, \$150; to J. W. Gorbett, damages, \$1.00.

Final action by the Board of County Commissioners on the road petitioned for by M. A. Childs and others:

The petition of M. A. Childs and others for the establishment of road being under consideration of the Board for final action, it is determined and ordered by the Board that the public good and convenience does require that said road as viewed, located and surveyed be established, having a width of forty feet, and that damages be allowed the landowners as follows: to Roy Flory, for land and all other damages, \$400; to W. F. Smith, for land and all other damages, \$150; to J. W. Gorbett, for damages, \$1.00. It is also ordered that the Trustees of Marion Township be directed to open the road for public use.
