

# COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

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3. Where the full benefit assessment was paid in cash when assessed, and the title to the land still remains in the original owner.

(A) On land within one mile of the highway, you will refund the taxpayer in cash, on presentation of a Special Refund Warrant issued by order of the Board of County Commissioners and attested by the County Clerk, a sum equal to 80% of one-tenth of the total assessment (principal only) after deducting all refunds previously made.

(B) On land more than one mile from the highway, you will refund the taxpayer in cash on presentation of a special Refund Warrant issued by order of the Board of County Commissioners and attested by the County Clerk an amount equal to one-tenth of the total assessment (principal only) after deducting all refunds previously made.

4. Where the full benefit assessment was paid in cash when assessed and the title to the land has changed, you will make no refund until definitely authorized to do so by the State Highway Commission.

March 8, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Allowance of Claims against the county was completed at this meeting.

The Board spent some time in viewing the work being done at the Washington Creek bridge on the Lone Star Road.

A delegation of Eudora citizen appeared before the Board and asked that, if possible, the bridge across the Kansas River at Eudora be kept open for light travel during the period of making repairs on said bridge. The Board assured the delegation that, if possible, their request would be granted.

March 10, 1930

In accordance with a published notice in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World on February 5, 1930, the Board of County Commissioners met for the purpose giving a hearing on the petition of the City Commission of the City of Lawrence, filed February 1, 1930, asking the Board of County Commissioners to extend the corporate limits of said city of Lawrence to include certain described real estate set out in said petition.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, Earl T. Black, at 1.30 P. M. A petition signed by 64 property owners in the district desired to be annexed remonstrating the inclusion of the described territory in the corporate limits of the City of Lawrence was presented to the Board. A large number of the interested property owners of said district were present and were represented by F. Ellis Johnson, F. M. Springer, and Bruce McKee. The City of Lawrence was not represented. After hearing all parties who desired to speak the Board took the matter under advisement until a later hour in the day, when they made their findings, which are as follows.

Now, upon this 10 day of March, 1930, comes before us the City Commission of the City of Lawrence, by petition, praying that this Board extend the corporate limits of the said City of Lawrence to include certain real estate, set out and fully described in said petition. After hearing all parties, and from the evidence at hand we find that the boundaries sought to be established is not a road or other natural boundary: that said boundary line would in many instances divide tracts of land and lots, and in some instances divides buildings, which we believe would be a manifest injury to the property owner.

The petition is therefor denied.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present.

A petition signed by M. E. Forth and others of Marion Township praying for the improvement of a road on the Douglas-Franklin County line, beginning at the Southwest corner of section 18; T 15 S; R 19 E; thence west on the county line two miles, was received by the Board, whereupon they appointed themselves and the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, viewers and fixed the time for such view on April 10, at 9.30 o'clock, A. M. at the point of beginning of said described road. The County Clerk was directed to make the necessary legal publication

A petition signed by John T. Clark and others praying for the improvement of Road on the Douglas-Franklin County line, beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 13; T 15 S; R 18 E; thence west on or near the county line for a distance of one and one-half miles, came before the Board for consideration. The Board appointed themselves and the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, viewers, and directed the County Clerk to give the necessary legal notice of said to be made April 10, 1930 at 10.30 o'clock A. M. at the point of beginning.

A petition of M. E. Forth and others of Marion Township praying for the improvement of a road beginning at the Southwest corner of section 13; T15S; R18 E; thence North 1/2 mile; thence West 1/2 mile; thence North 1/2 mile; thence West five miles, came before the Board for consideration. The Board appointed themselves viewers, and directed the County Clerk to give the necessary legal notice that said view would be made April 10, 1930, at 1.30 o'clock P. M. meeting at the point of beg.
