April 7, 1930

The Beard of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of April with Earl T. Black, Chairman, EJ. Hill and Z. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the meetings of the Board held on March 3, 5, 8, and 13, 1930 were read and approved. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per A;; owance Register.

The County Clerk was directed to issue a Refund Warrant to W. H. Webster and Foucher in the sum of \$9.62 on account of error in assessing personal property in Baldwin City when it should have been assessed in School District 87 in Palmyra township, the difference in rate being \$2.60 per hundred dollars valuation.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by E. J. Hill, the following resolution was unanimously adopted by the Board.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLUTION BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, on this 7th day of April, 1930, that Federal District Court suit #666666666 pending in the District Court of the United States for the district of Kansas, First Division, wherein the Union Pacific Railroad Company is plaintiff, and the County Commissioners of Douglas County, Annass, is defendant, be settled and dis-missed in accordance with the following stipulation:

It is hereby stipulated and agreed by and between the parties herete that the contraversy over special assessments described abd referred to in the plaintiff's bill of complaint be settled by compromise on the following terms: First: Annual assessments for a period of nine years, covering the years 1930 to 1938, inclusive, shall be levied against the Union Pacific Railrod Company as the owner of property in the Benefit District for Federal Aid Froject 129-D, each annual assessment not to exceed \$429.33, which amount will be neid by the

First: Annual assessments for a period of nine years, covering the years 1930 to 1938, inclusive, shall be levied against the Union Facific Railrod Company as the owner of property in the Benefit District for Federal Aid froject 129-D, each annual assessment not to exceed \$429.33, which amount will be paid by the Union Facific Railroad Company when levied. Refunds on said assessment as now provided in Section 18, Chapter 225, Laws of 1929, and/or any such refunds as may be provided by any other law on the assessments so made, shall be the property of, and shall be paid to Union Pacific Railrod Company promptly when made. Second: The respondents herein, The Tar d of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the County Clerk and the County Tressurer of Douglas County, Kansas, agree that Douglas County, Kansas, will pay the annual interest on bonds issued for or on account of the portion of the cost of said pavement assessed against property of Union Facific Railrod Company, and will hold the Union Facific Railrod Company harmless from liability for any interest due or to become due thereon for the year 1930 or any year thereafter. Third: Union Facific Railroad Company shall pay to the County Tresurer of Douglas County, Kansas, promptly, after the filing of this s/tipulation, the sum of \$289.79, said sum including an item of \$203.93 which is the interest for the year 1929 on bonds issued and ourstanding on account of portion of the cost of said imorévenent assessed to Union Pacific Railread Company, and including also an item of \$85.85 which is 20% of the principal of the sames state High-way Commission. The respondents herein agree to hold the Union Pacific Railroad Company hermless against and shall fur ther principal or interest or interestfor the 1929 assessment aforeadid. This stipulation and agreement ahall be binding upon the Compleinant herein its successors and assigns, and shall fur there principal or interest or interestfor the 1929 assessment aforeadid. On motion the Board directed the County Clerk to issue an order directing the County Tresurer to clese the County and State Road Fund account into the County Read Fund account, the County & State Road Fund account being dead on the Ledger RARRA STREAMER.

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
