The Baards of County Commissioners of Douglas County and Franklin County met in joint session on the Douglas-Franklin County line to view the road as petitioned for and published in the Lawrence Democrat March 20, 1930. After a view of the joantly petitioned roads, the Boards acted favorably of the petition of John T. Clark and others, and ordered the Township Boards of Marion Township, Douglas County and ENN Centrepolis Township of Franklin County to open and grade the road beginning at the southwest corner of section 13.- 15- 18; thence west commission one-half miles in accordance with lines run by the County Engineers.

The Joint Boards considered the petition of C. H. Clark and others for a bridge across Eight mile Creek near the half section line of Sec. 23-15-18. The Boards were unanimous in their epinions that a bridge was needed, but owning to the depleted con-dition of the bridge funds of each of the Counties it was decided to deferr this work and make it a gart of the budget for 1930. The afternonn was spent by the Douglas County Beard in viewing the road petitioned by M. E. Forth and others, said road beginning at the southwest corner of section thants 13-15-18, thence north & mile, thence west & mile, thence north & mile, thence west widening of road, where needed, to 60 feet, and the addition of said described for the system of County Roads. The Board decided not te designated the said described read as a County Road at this time but ordered the Township Board of Marion Township go make improvements on said described under the direction of the County Engineer

April 12, 1930 The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board finished the allowing claims for the month March. No other business of record was transacted at this meeting.

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April 16, 1930 The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The Board spent the day in discussing county affairs. Nothing of official record was done.
