

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

June 2, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of June with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the regular session for the month of May held May 5 - 7 - 10 - 14, were read and approved. The Board spent the day in allowing claims as recorded in the Allowance Register.

June 4, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board gave its attention to the allowing of claims against the county during the forenoon. In the afternoon the Board together with the County Engineer viewed roads.

June 7, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing of May claims against the county at this meeting.

June 11, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board ordered Refunding Warrants drawn as follows. To C. B. Coffman for the sum \$1.90, the same being erroneous taxes on improvements which did exist on Sec. 32, T 12, R 20. To J. J. Hayden in the sum of \$5.28, the same being double taxes on real estate in Sec. 10, T 14, R 19 for the years 1928 and 1929

June 18, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. This meeting was called for the purpose of considering the demands of the State Banks to pay their 1929 taxes at the intangible rate of 50 cents per \$100 valuation. The courts having already ruled that State Banks could not be taxed at a greater rate than the National Banks, the Board ordered the County Treasurer to receive from the State Banks their tax at the intangible rate. The Board ordered the County Clerk to issue to the County Treasurer a cancellation order cancelling the difference in tax between the ad valorem tax and intangible tax of all State Banks where such difference existed. The County Clerk was also ordered to draw refund warrant in the favor of such state banks as has paid the ad valorem rate for the year 1929 in an amount equal to the difference of such ad valorem tax paid and the intangible tax.

The minutes of the regular session for the month of June, as well as, the special meeting of June 18, 1930, were read and approved this 1 day of July, 1930

July 7, 1930

Claims against the county were presented to the Board and allowed as per Allowance Register.

The resignation of C. M. Fisher as constable in and for the City of Lawrence was presented to the Board and on motion properly made and seconded was accepted.
