August 4, 1930 The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of August with Rarl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the Board's meetings held July 7 - 9 - 12 - 16 were read and approved. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per record in the Allowance Register. A delegation of taxpavars came becaut the T

A delegation of taxpayers came before the Board and presented to the Board a petition requesting the Board of County Commissioners to limit the levy for Farm Bureau work in the county to the statutory minimum of \$1200. Mr. C. E. Kretsinger addressed the Board in behalf of the petitioners.

August 6, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Fommi ssioners, and the County Clerk present.

Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register The Board ordered a refund of \$3.68 to Asa Judy, 632 Mich. St. on account of no exemption of personal property being allowed by the deputy assessor.

August 8m 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met as a canvassing board for the purpose of canvassing the votes cast at the Primary Election held August 5, 1930. The Board consisted of Earl T. Black as chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, members, and C. O. Bowman, clerk. The results are duly recorded an the Abstarct of Primary Elections.

August 9, 1930.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing of claims against the county for the regular session. The question of tax levies for the current tax year was discussed but no definite action was taken owning to the fact that the State Tax Commission had not, as yet, certified the valuation for the County.

August 18, 1930.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all mem-bers and the County Clerk present. This being the last meeting of the regular session for the month of August. the matter of tax levies for the year 1930 came before the Board for consideration. Thereupon, there was presented to the Board a resolution fixing the tax levies for the year 1930, and on motion of E. J. Hill, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, the resolution was adopted by a unanimous wote of the Beard. The Resolution adopted is as follows:

The leve HSCIDTION, 1930 THE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled this 13th day of August, 1930, that, for the purpose of raising revenue for the taxing year of 1930, there be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said Douglas County, taxes as follows and for the purposes indi-cated, such taxes represented by mills and fractions of mills on the dollar valuation as set out below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, for the purpose of paying tuition of pupils in high schools during the taxibg year of 1930, based on the estimate certified by the County Superentendent of Public Instruction, there be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said County of Douglas, not otherwise taxed for high school purposes, a tax of 1.01 millson the dollar valuation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, for the purpose of raising revenue to pay bonds and interest coming due during the taxing year 1930, there be and is hereby levied on all taxable property subject thereto, the following taxes represented by mills and fraction of mills on the dollar valuation as set out below.

.91 mills on all taxable property in Grant Township for Ft. to Ft. bonds & Int. .57 mills on all taxable property in Grant Township for US73W bonds & interest.

.30 mills on all taxable property in Wakarusa Township for Fort to Fort bonds & Int. .31 mills on all taxable property in Wakarusa Township for US73W bonds & interest. .23 mills on all taxable property in Wakarusa Township County Road Improvement Bonds and Interest,

5.50 mills on all taxable property in Kanwaka Township for Ft.to Ft. bonds & Int.

1.84 mills on all taxable property in Lecompton Township, including Lecomptom City, for Fort to Fort bonds and interest. .47 mills on all taxable property in Lecompton Township, including Lecomptom City, for County Road Improvement bonds and interest.

.83 mills on all taxable property in Clinton Township for County Road Improve ment bonds and interest.

.23 mills on all taxable property in Palmyra Township, including Baldwin City, for County Road Improvement bonds and interest.

.91 mills on all taxable property in Willow Springs Township for County Road Improvement bonds and interest.

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
