This being the first regular session After the Primary Election the Board of County Commissioners in presence of the County Clerk canvassed the Absent Voters ballots. The results are made a part of the General Primary Abstract.

The Board opened the bids previously submitted for furnishing the County coal and the contract was awarded to the University Coal Co. to furnish approximately 200 tons of Cornell Deep Shovel Lump f.o.b. Lawrence and India at \$4.90 per ton for September delivery and at \$5.30 per ton the remainder of the season.

September 3rd, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Register.

The petition of R. M. Gray and others for the location of a road beginning at quarter section corner on the north line of section 31, T13S, R19E, a point on the present established Sanded County Road, No. 22, thence north symmetrically about the quarter section line of Section 30, T13S, R19E, a distance of 3/4 of a mile, more or less, and terminatin in the present established road, No. 150, as established and located, came before the Board for consideration. Whereupon the Board appointed themselves viewers, and fixed the time and place of said view for October 3rd, 1930, at 9.30 o'clock A. M. at the place of beginning of said petitioned road, and directed the County Clerk to give legal notice of said view.

The petition of O. M. Hird and others for the vacation of a road, beginning, at the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Sec. 11, T15S, R12E, thence north one-half mile, and terminating at the northeast corner of the northwest of the northwest quarter of Sec. 11, T15S, R12S, came before the Board for consideration. Whereupon the Board appointed themselves viewers, and fixed the time and place of said view for October 3rd, 1930, at 11 o'clock A.M. at the place of beginning of said road.

The petition of H. E. Unger and others for the location of a County Road in the south portion of Kanwaka Township as follows: From the Patton Bridge to run in a notherly direction on the section line, or as near thereto as possible, to a point where it would join the now established North and South county road. came before the Board for consideration. Whereupon the Board appointed themselves viewers, and fixed the time and place of said view for October 15, 1930, at 11.30 o'clock P. M. at the place of beginning of said petitioned road, and directed the County Clerk to give the proper legal notice of said view.

The petition of R. A. Baldwin and others for the vacation of a road beginning at the quarter corner on the south line of Sec. 30, T12S, R18E, thence north one mile and terminating at the quarter corner on the north line of Sec. 30, T12S, R18E, came before the Board for consideration. Whereupon the Board appointed themselves viewers, and fixed the time and place of said view on October 15, 1930, at 3.30 o'clock P. M. at the place of beginning of said road, and directed the county clerk to give legal notice of said view.

September 6, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill, X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing of claims for the September session. No other business of record was transacted at this meeting.

September 10, 1930

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and E. J. Hill, Commissioners and U. S. G. Plank, Deputy County Clerk, present. The Board spent the day in inspecting roads and bridges.

The minutes of the Board's meeting held during the month of September were read and approve October 6, 1930.
