M., or as soon thereafter as the same can be heard, and directed the County Clerk to serve the measurer legal papers .

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned reular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, E. J. Hill and X. J. Kennedy, Commissionerss, and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per record.

The County Commissioners issued an order releasing Sam "Duke" Scott from the County Jail on the payment of \$160 , the balance of the fine being remitted.
