February 2, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met in regular session for the month of February with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the meetings held January 5, 7, 10, and 14 were read and approved. The Board spent the day allowing claims as per Allowance Register.

February 4, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Claims against the County were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

The Board of City Commissioners of the City of Lawrence met with the Board of County Commissioners for the purpose of agreeing on a plan whereby the City of Lawrence will be able to absorb special taxes paid them by the county but not collected by the County Treasurer. The matter was thoroughly discussed by the Boards and it was agreed that the City Clerk, City Attorney, the County Clerk and the County Treasurer should formulate in writing the plan agreed upon and submit it to the Boards for their final approval.

On motion of Earl T. Black, Seconded by X. J. Kennedy the Board unanimously voted to designate The Douglas County Republican as the official county paper for the ensuing year, the official county printing to be done at the following rate: 50 cents for the first insertion of 250 ems and 25 cents for each subsequent insertion of 250 ems.

February 7, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

## Resolution

Whereas, all hedges along County Highways constitute a menace to travel at road intersections and interfere with grading, constructing and maintaining of said Highways;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 7th day of February, 1931, that the County Engineer be, and is hereby instructed to cause to be removed all such hedges as provided in sec. 19-2612 Revised Statutes, 1923

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by Earl T. Black, the above resolution and order was unanimously adopted by the Board

There was presented to the Board a petition signed by E. G. Bond and others for to location of a road described as follows: Beginning at a point in road No. 424 on the line between sections 29 and 30, 13 - 19, 1100 feet north of the quarter corner of said section; thence west about 1320 feet to a point in road No. 539; thence north on said road about 230 feet to intersect a road now travelled; thence following the road as now travelled until it intersects road No. 150 running north and south on the range line between ranges 18 and 19, and terminating therein.

Also to vacate the following described roads: the south half mile of Road No. 424 between sections 29 and 30-13-19; that part of road No. 244 as not used in the above location; that part of road No. 539 as not used in the above location; that part of road 150 as not used in the above location; that part of road No. 22 along the south line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  30-13-19, and long the south side of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  25-13-18.

The petition being found regular and in due form, the Board appointed themselves, E. J. Hill, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black as viewers, and directed the County Clerk to give legal notice that said would be viewed Marc 6, 1931 at 10 o'clock A. M.

The petition of Ralph Ward and others for addition to the County Road System of a road beginning at the Southwest corner of section 5-13-20, thence north one mile, was presented to the Board. The Board deferred action on said petition.

February 11, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The board completed the allowing of claims for this session.

The application of the Kansas Physical Education Corporation for the exemption from taxation of lots 9 and 10, block 25, Sinclairs Addition, was presented to the Board. The County Clerk was directed to forward the application to the State Tax commission with the recommendation that that said described property be exempted for the year 1931, and thereafter so long as held the above corporation or by the State University.

The application of the Board of Education of the City of Lawrence for exemption of Lots 129, 131, 133, 135 and 137, Miss. St., and lots 132, 134, 136 and 138 Ill. St., was referred to the State Tax Commission with the recommendation that it be exempted for the year 1931 and thereafter, but with the recommendation that the prayer of the petitioner for a refund of the first half of the 1930 taxes paid, be refunded, and that the second half of the 1930 taxes be cancelled, be denied.
