The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of March with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

March 4, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were allowed as per Allowance Register.

The petition of G. E. Kretsinger and other of Palmyra Township for a county road beginning in front of Chas E. Beeks' house, thence east and north over the present Dell Road to Al Andrews north line near the NW. Corner of sec. 26-14-20; thence east to the Northwest corner of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 25-14-20; thence south to U. S. No. 50, was filed with the County Clerk, and taken under advisement by the Board.

A petition for a county road beginning at the northwest corner of sec. 13-14-17 a point in the present established Twin Mound County Road; thence south and east to the south section line of said section 13; thence east on said south section line to a point near the quarter corner on said south section line; thence south on or near the quarter section line of sections 24, 25 and 36, three miles to the quarter section corner on the south line of sec. 36-14-17, which point is in the US 50 Highway and Franklin County Road; was signed by S. E. Dodder and others and presented to the Board of County Commissioners. The Board deferred action on said petition.

March 7, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with E. J. Hill, Chairman and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioner, and the County Clerk present. Earl T. Black being absent on account of snow storm. No business of record was transacted other than allowing claims.

March 11, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing claims for the month of February.

A petition for the enlargement of Drainage District #4 in Grant Township was presented to the Board. The petition being found in due and regular form the Board set March 25, 1931 at 2 o'clock P. M. as the time of hearing on said petition, and directed that proper legal notice be given by publication in the official paper.

On motion of Earl T. Black, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, ~~thereafter~~ J. M. Mabb of Baldwin city was appointed constable for Palmyra Township

March 25, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, consisting of E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T.
