This entry is for the purpose of transferring to the Bond and Interest account a part of the County-Township fund derived from the gasoline tax and credited to the Road Fund.

COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

The County Board of Equalization consisting of E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, as members and C. O. Bowman, as clerk met in regular session for the year 1931, on May 18, 1931, and remained in session until May 28, as required by law. During this ten day session the Board considered such applications for relief from assessments as came before them, the number of complaints being few. Such changes as the Board allowed on personal property assessments have been noted on the personal property assessment rolls; and such changes in real estate assessments as allowed by the Board are noted on the real estate assessment rolls in red ink. The Board fixed a value of one dollar per running foot on commercial advertising signs placed in the county. The Board adjourned on the May 28, 1931 until June 3, 1931.
