

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

August 29, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session with E. J. Hill, Chairman, Earl T. Black and X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the county clerk present. This special meeting of the Board was for the purpose of hearing complaints and considering objections to the special assessments levied by the Board of County Commissioners on July 11, 1931, against the real estate embraced in the benefit district of the TWIN MOUND ROAD. The hour of ten o'clock A. M. having arrived and all members of the Board being present, the chairman called the meeting to order. Several taxpayers and interested persons were present. No particular complaints were entered as to the assessments, however, several questions regarding the manner of assessing and time and privilege of paying the tax were asked and answered to the satisfaction of the taxpayer.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy seconded by Earl T. Black the Board unanimously approved the assessments as made July 11 1931. The meeting was then adjourned.

The minutes of the meetings held August 3, 5, 8, 12, 17 and 20 were read and approved this 9 day of September, 1931

September 8, 1931

Monday September 7, being Labor Day, the Board of County Commissioners met in their first meeting September 8, with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the Board's proceedings for the month of August were read and approved. Claims against the County were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

The Board ordered Refunding Warrant issued as follows:

No. 586 to J. L. Kofer for \$8.67, Error in payment of tax
No. 587 to Roger W. Williams \$27.84, Error in payment of tax
No. 588 to Board of Education, School District 60, \$151.91, abatement by the State Tax Commission.

September 9, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular with all members and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing of claims for this session.

Bids for furnishing the county with coal for the year were received from Harry Turner Coal Co.; Kaw Valley Fuel Co.; University Coal Co.; McConnell Lumber & Lignite Co.; and the Williamsburg Coal Co., ranging in price from \$4.00 per ton to \$5.80 per ton f.o.b. Lawrence. On motion of Mr. Black, Seconded by Mr. Kennedy, the contract for 200 tons, more or less, of Pittsburg-Midway Coal was unanimously let to the Kaw Valley Fuel Co. of Lawrence for \$4.00 per ton f.o.b. Lawrence.

September 12, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy, Commissioner, and the County Clerk present. Mr. Black was unavoidably absent from this meeting. The two members of the Board, the County Engineer and the County Clerk spent the morning in viewing the Harrison Road.

On motion of Mr. Hill, seconded by Mr. Kennedy it was ordered that the County Clerk instruct the Treasurer to cancel tax and penalty on sales as numbered below, it being the tax on \$650 valuation on improvements that did not exist.

September 16, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The Board in company with the County Engineer spent the day in viewing roads and bridges. No business of record was transacted.

September 17, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. This meeting was for the purpose of a final hearing on the petition of S. J. Hunter and others for the permanent improvement of certain roads in Wakarusa Township and fully described in the publication notice of August 13, 1931.

The hour of 11 o'clock A. M. having arrived, and all members of the Board being present, and no protests or objections to the proposed improvements having been made, and the Board being fully advised in the matter, it was moved by X. J. Kennedy and seconded by Earl T. Black that the prayer of the petition be granted. The motion was then put by the chairman and unanimously adopted. The Clerk was directed to advertise for bids in accordance with plans and specifications furnished by the Engineer.
