

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

November 2, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session this 2 day of November, 1931, with E. J. Hill, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and Earl T. Black, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The minutes of the Board meetings held October 5 - 7 - 10 - 14 - 18 were read and approved. Claims against the county were presented to the Board and allowed as recorded in the Allowance Register.

No other business of record was transacted by the Board at this meeting.

November 4, 1931.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were allowed as per Allowance register.

The Board authorized the admittance of Mildred Thurman to the State Hospital for Tuberculosis for treatment.

On motion of Earl T. Black, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, the unanimously voted to purchase from the Allis-Chalmers Mfg. Co., one Model 75 tractor for the sum of \$4500. to be paid for on or before May 1, 1932, at the option of the county, without interest.

The Board instructed the County Clerk to attend a meeting of the State Tax Commission to be held Nov. 5, at Topeka, relative to a suit in equity filed in the Federal Court by The Stanolind Pipe Line Co., asking for a reduction in their assessed valuation in Douglas and other counties through which their lines run/

November 7, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Additional claims against the County were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

The matter of issuing bonds on account of the Twin Mound Sand Road came before the Board for consideration. It was suggested that if the Townships, Marion and Clinton, would meet their share of this road improvement out of their own funds for the year 1931, it would be unnecessary to issue bonds on this project. The Marion Township Board being present, they assured the County Board that their township would meet their obligation for this road project during this taxing year, and requested that no bonds be issued. The county Clerk was instructed to request the Clinton Township Board to meet with the County Commissioners at 2 o'clock, Tuesday, Nov. 10, 1931, to discuss their share of this expense.

The County Clerk reported to the Board the result of his conference with the State Tax Commission on the suit filed in the Federal Courts by the Stanolind Pipe Line Co. The State Tax Commission has requested the counties interested in this suit such evidence of actual appraisals of properties in their respective counties as may be deemed of value in contesting this suit. On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by Earl T. Black, it was unanimously voted to furnish such actual appraisals of properties within Douglas County as the State Tax Commission may deem necessary.

November 10, 1931

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the Deputy County Clerk present.

The following resolution came before the Board for consideration;

RESOLUTION

NOW, AND ON THIS 10th Day of November, 1931, the Board of County Commissioners being in session, do adopt the following resolution.

RESOLVED THAT WE, hereby offer one hundred dollars (\$100) reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the party or parties who took some forty(40) head of cattle from the Morgan Brothers' pastures in Grant Township, Douglas County, Kansas, on or about the 29th of October, 1931.
