The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of April with X. J. Kennedy, Chairman, Earl T. Black and E. J. Hill, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the meetings held March 7 - 9 - 12 and 16, 1932, were read and approved. Claims against the county were allowed as per Allowance register.

On motion properly made and seconded, the Board of County Commissioners adopted the following resolution.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the governin body of the city of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, has adopted a rselution rescinding its action of date of 26, 1928, and all amendatory resolutions in connection therewith, and declaring that the paving and improving of East 15th street, and East 15th street extended, city of Lawrence, Kansas, is not a work of public necessity, convenience or utility, and has transmitted said resolution to this board for action;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, Kansas, that it does hereby approve and adopt the above resolution of the governing body of the city of Lawrence, Kansas, and does hereby likewise rescind an revoke its resolution of April 4, 1928, and all amendatory resolutions thereto and passed in connection therewith with reference to the paving of said East 15th street, and East 15th street extended, in the city of Lawrence, Kansas, and this board does hereby declare that said paving and said improvement of said East 15th street and East 15th street extendedunnecessary, inexpedient, not a work of public necessity, convenience or utility and because of many changed conditions(some of which are recited in the resolution of said governin body of the city of Lawrence)this board deems it inexpedient that said improvement be made.

Rumsey Bros., Undertakers, were authorized by the Board of County Commissioners to go to Garnett and claim the Body of Evelyn Patterson, bring it to Lawrence and give it burial at county expense.

The Board of County Commissioners, as viewers, together with the county engineer, went to Budora Township and viewed the road petitioned by C. C. Gerstenberger as advertised in the official paper under date of March, 17, 1932.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The Commissioners allowed claims as per record.

Road Viewers Report

We, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, acting as viewers of a petitioned for by C. C. Gerstenberger and others of Budora Township and in accordance with legal notice given, did on the 6th day of April, 1932, meet at the point of beginning of said petitioned road and proceeded to view said road as prayed for in said petition, or as nearley as we consider a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking in to consideration the utility, convenience, inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals, as well as to the public, if said road or any part thereof be established for public use as follows:

Beginning at a point .227 chains north of the North West corner of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 8, Township 18, Range 21; thence north in and along the west line of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 8 to the Northwest corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 8, a point in State Highway No. 10, and terminating therein.

The route of said road was surveyed under our direction by C. E. Ellebrook, county surveyor and A. L. Cox, chainman,

Now, therefore, this petition of C. C. Gerstenberger and others for the establishment of a road comes before the Board of County Commissioners for final action, and it is determined and ardered by the Board that the public good and convenience does that said road as viewed, located and surveyed be established; and we further determine and order that the width of said road be sixty feet, and that Budora Township shall pay damages for land taken at the rate of \$75 per acre and build a 4 wire fence on each side of said road. The Board further determines the damages accruing under this order are as follows: To Kate Werzeldorfer the sum of \$42.60; to Teekla Eder, the sum of \$29.02; to Mo;vie E. Pilla, the sum of \$60.96. It is also ordered by the Board that such sums awarded as damages shall become due and payable only of the filing of a certificate by the Township trustee of Budora Township that the road has actually been opened and used for public travel.

It is hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that these proceedings and the report of survey be recorded, and that the Trustee of Budora Township be directed to open said road.
