RESOLUTION LEVYING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT Whereas, a petition was filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Mansas, August 5, 1931, and in accordance with the previsions of law as set forth in Section 68-728, 1930 Supplement to the Revised Statutes of Kansas, 1923, praying for the implovement of certain roads in Douglas County, Kansas, named and fully described in said petition as Starstford Road, West Hills Farkway and West Hills Terrace. Whereas, the Board of County commissioners met on the 17th day of September, 1931, as provided in the above mentioned publication, and there being no protests, com-plaints, or written objections to the proposed improvements therein set out, and the Board being fully advised in the matter, granted the prayer of the petition and di-rected the County Clerk to advertise for bids on the proposed improvements in ac-cordance with plans and specifications furnished by the engineer.
