

## COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION June 16, 1932

The Board of County Commissioners met as required by law as a County Board of Equalization with the following members present: X. J. Chairman, Earl T. Black and E. J. Hill, members and C. O. Bowman, Clerk. The Board was in session ten days, exclusive of Sunday. Action was taken on complaints as follows.
