

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

August 9, 1932

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the county clerk present. Additional claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register

The tax committee of the Chamber of Commerce met with the Board to discuss informally certain items set out in the proposed county budget for the year 1932

The Board and the County Engineer made an inspection of road work being done. Adjournment was taken to August 10, 1932.

August 10, 1932,

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present.

The County Clerk was authorized to pay the judges and clerks employed in conducting the Primary Election held August 2, 1932.

A refund of \$6.50 was given John A. Reeder on account of an erroneous assessment against on NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$, 28-14-20 for surveyors fee. Refunding Warrant No. 597 was issued in payment thereof and charged to Surveyors Fund/.

A road petition signed by J. D. Martin and others asking for vacation of a road beginning at the center quarter corner in section 10, T13S, R20E, thence East to the center quarter corner in section 11, T13S, R20E, was presented to the Board, and the petition being found in due and regular form, the Board set September 14, 1932, at 1 o'clock P. M. to view said, and directed the county clerk to give legal notice as required by law.

A petition signed by G. A. Dreyer and others praying for the location and vacation of a road as follows. For Location: Beginning at a point in the section line between sections 1 and 2, - 12 - 17, 1670 feet south of the quarter corner between said sections, said point also being a point in old road No. 107, thence north on line between said sections to the quarter corner between said sections and terminating therein; and to vacate all portions of old road No. 107 between point of beginning and ending of road ~~road~~ to be located, Said road to be 40 feet wide, the land for which is to be dedicated for such purpose by the landowners, was presented to the Board for consideration. The petition being found regular and in due form the Board set September 14, 1932, at 3.30 o'clock as the time for view and hearing and directed the County Clerk to give legal notice of such view and hearing.

This being the day set for a public hearing on the County Budget as prepared by the Board of County Commissioners and advertised according to law, and the designated hour of Ten o'clock having arrived, the chairman of the board called the meeting to order and stated the object of the meeting and the manner of conducting it, Commissioner Earl T. Black then made a clear and concise statement regarding the budget, its proposed saving, and the attitude of the Board in the matter of economy for the ensuing year. The hearing was conducted in an orderly system and the discussions were, as a whole, sensible and to the point. The Farm Bureau members urged an increase in the amount set out in the budget for its support during the coming year. It was equally urged that conditions did not warrant any increase in the expenditure of tax money. No further discussion being offered the hearing adjourned. The Board of County Commissioners did then adjourn to Aug. 17, 1932.

August 17, 1932

The Board met in adjourned regular session with X. J. Kennedy, Chairman, Earl T. Black and E. J. Hill, Commissioners and the county clerk present.

The question of fixing the tax levies for the year 1932 came before the Board for final consideration. The Board being advised that a change in the budget at any other time than at the hearing would be illegal, and no changes having been made on the date of hearing, August 10, the Board adopted the following resolution.

TAX LEVY RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 17th day of August, 1932, that for the purpose of raising revenue to defray the expenses of Douglas County for the ensuing taxing year, and for the purpose of reimbursing said county for money expended, there be and are hereby levied on all the tangible taxable property in Douglas County, Kansas, taxes as follows and for the purposes indicated, such taxes being represented by mills and fraction of mills on the dollar valuation as set out below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the purpose of paying tuition of pupils in high schools during the ensuing taxing year, there be and is hereby levied on all tangible taxable property in Douglas County, Kansas, not otherwise taxed for high school purposes, a tax on 1.87 mills on the dollar valuation.
