The Boards being fully advised in the matter, and after hearing all perties interested, the Boards found as follows; that the public necessity, convenience and safety requires that the prayer of the petition be granted, and that the road between the point of beginning the point of ending as petitioned, be widened on the east side of the east line of the present right-of-way 25 feet, and that T. 0. Dwyer be awarded damages in the amount of (\$1000 One Hundred Pollars, to be paid Fifty Pollars each by the adjoining Townships in Douglas and Johnson Counties respectively. C. Dwyer as the Townships share of the One Hundred Dollars awarded by the Boards of Viewers for damages and land taken.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KARSAS, IN REGULAR MEETING ASSEMBLED THISS 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1932, that the question of the adoption of the County Road Unit System under Section 68-516, Suppleme to the Revised Statutes of Manses, 1923, be submitted to the electors of Douglas County, Kansas, at the regular election to be held November 8, 1932, and that at said election the vote shall be taken for or against the adoption of the County Road Unit System, and that if at said election the majority of the votes cast are for the adoption of said County Road Unit System, the same shall be in force and effect in Douglas County, Kansas, thereafter, Attest.
