The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of February with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the meetings of the Board of Commissioners held January 2, 4, 7, and 11, 1933, were read and approved. Claims against the county were allowed as per Allowance Register,

The Board, after due investigation, found that there had been paid for Bounty an amount in excess of the amount raised by levy for this purpose, did, on motion by Kennedy, seconded by Brass, ordered the payment of bounty discontinued.

On Motion by Kennedy, seconded by Black, the county clerk was directed to instruct the county treasurer to make transfers of the following funds:

Transfer from the Crippled Childrens Fund to the County General Fund the sum of \$151.78, this amount being the balance in Crippled Childrens fund Dec. 31, 1932.  
Transfer from the County-Township Road Fund to the County Road Fund the sum of \$5282.18, being the county's Share of the state allotment for the fourth quarter of 1932.

Transfer from the Bounty Fund to the County General Fund the sum of \$1015.64 to reimburse the general fund for bounty paid

Pursuant to adjournment had on Feb. 8, 1933, the Board of County Commissioners met this 11 day of February, 1933, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners and the county clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register. No further business appearing the Board, on motion properly made and seconded, adjourned to Feb. 16, 1933.

February 16, 1933

The Board of County Commissioners met this 15 day of February, pursuant to adjournment of Feb. 11, 1933, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the county clerk present.

The Board having previously advertised for proposals to do the County Official printing for the year beginning March 1, 1933, and proposals having been filed by The Lawrence Democrat, The Douglas County Republican, The World Company, and the Baldwin Ledger, the Board considered these proposals, and accepted the proposal of the World Co. (The Lawrence Daily Journal-World) at 30 cents per square of 250 ems for the first insertion, and 15 cents per square of 250 ems for each succeeding insertion for all official county printing, including the delinquent and final Tax notice, and on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass The Lawrence Daily Journal-World was designated as the official county paper for the ensuing year beginning March 1, 1933.

On motion properly made and seconded, the Board adopted the following resolution.

## RESOLUTION

Accepting trust proposal of the Governor of Kansas for the establishment and operation of an emergency relief fund from federal emergency relief funds for the payment of work-relief wages on work-relief project No. 16-13, entitled "Cutting Tress at County Farm"

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS:

Section 1. That the county commissioners hereby accept the proposal of the Governor of Kansas for the establishment and operation of an emergency relief fund from federal emergency relief funds for the payment of work relief wages on Work Relief Project No. 16-13 entitled "Cutting Tress at County Farm".

Section 2. That there is hereby established a fund entitled "The Emergency Relief Fund" in which the county treasurer shall keep any monies coming into his hands for such fund, and he shall keep it in the same manner as he keeps the other funds of the county, and he shall be liable for the safe keeping and proper application of said emergency relief funds to the same extent as the other funds of the county. The financial officers of the county are hereby directed and required to do all the things required in the foregoing Governor's proposal and by the rules and regulations of the Kansas Federal Relief Committee pertaining to the same.
