May 3, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment taken on May 3, 1933, the Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session this 6th day of May, 1933 with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the county clerk present. The Board allowed such claims as were payable from the road and bridge funds. No further business of record was transacted at this meeting. On motion by Kennedy, seconded By Brass adjournment, adjournment was taken to May 10. 1933.

May 10, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment taken May 6, 1933, The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session this 10th day of May, 1933, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present

At the request of the Kansas Federal Relief Committee, the Board directed the County Clerk to instruct the County Treasurer to combine all relief work project funds into one account, name; y Federal Relief Work Fund.

The Board spent part of the day in inspection of the work being done at the Staebler rock quarry and the distribution of the crushed rock on the roads.

On motion made by Kennedy and seconded by Brass, the Board adjourned to May 15, 1933.

May 15, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment taken May 10, 1933, the Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

This being the day fixed by House Bill No. 745, passed by the 1933 Session of the Kansas Legislature, for allowing claims against the County of Douglas, which claims were for services or materials furnished said county prior to May 1, 1933, and were not allowed at a previous meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, there was presented to the Board by the county clerk all such claims on file in his office. The following claims were disallowed, or allowed in part.

Kennedy the Board directed the County Clerk to give legal notice, by publication, that the Board of County Commissioners, acting under House Bill No. 745, 1933 Session of the Kansas Legislature, would issue approximately \$42,000 in Douglas County Funding Bonds, said bonds to be dated July 1, 1933.

On motion By X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board adjourned to May 25, 1933.

Gentlemen:

The City Commission hereby request the Board of County Commissioners to find it advisable to add the following described territory to the City of Lawrence, plats and dedications of the said territory having been presented to the City Commission by the proper authorities and approved by the Commission:

Beginning at a point three hundred thirty (330) feet south, and seven hundred fifty eight and five tenths (758.5) feet east of the North west corner of the South east $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 36 T 12 S-R 19 E; thence west seven hundred fifty eight and five tenths (758.5) feet to the west line of the South east $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Sec. 36; thence south on the west line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. sixteen hundred fifty two and two tenths (1552.2) feet; thence west three hundred thirty one and one tenth (331.1) feet; thence south six hundred sixty two and three tenths (662.3) feet; thence east three hundred thirty and six tenths (330.6) feet to the Southwest corner of the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 36, T 12 S-R 19 E; thence south six hundred sixty (660) feet; thence east eleven hundred thirty one and five tenths (1131.5) feet; thence north six hundred sixty feet to the north line Sec. 1 T 13 S-R 19 E; thence north ten hundred twenty one and five tenths (1021.5) feet; thence east five hundred and three tenths feet (500.3), on the south line of Thirteenth Street projected west, to a point ten hundred one and twenty two hundredths feet (1001.22) west of the East line of Sec. 36-T 12S - R 19 E; thence north, parallel to Mississippi Street, six hundred eighty eight (688) feet; thence west five hundred and three tenths (500.3) feet; thence north six hundred sixty (660) feet; thence west three hundred eighty nine and six tenths (389.6) feet to the point of beginning.
