The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The following communication was presented to the Board for consideration

Gentlemen:

The undersigned are advised that you are about to refund your indebtedness in harmony with House Bill No. 745, duly enacted by the Kansas Legislature at its session of 1933, and that it will require the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$41,889.22, or approximately in that amount; that said bonds will be dated July 1, 1933 and will mature serially after July 1, 1935 up to July 1, 1944 and will bear interest at the rate of 4 and 3/4%, payable semiannually.

We, the undersigned, hereby jointly offer to buy said bonds at par, with accrued interest, after July 1, 1933, to date of delivery, This offer is made contingent upon the legal validity of said bonds to be determined by our attorney.

The bonds are to be printed and delivered free of any expense to us. You are to furnish transcript and any further information necessary to help our attorney examine and pass upon the legality of said bonds. Said bonds are to be paid for by us in cash upon delivery. Interest and principal are to be paid at the office of the State Treasurer in Topeka, Kansas.
