June 5, 1933

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met in regular session for the month of June, 1933, with Early T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the county clerk present. The minutes of May 1, 5, 6, 10, 15, 25, and 31, were read and approved.

An order of the State Tax Commission dated June 1, 1933, granting Douglas County a dispensation under House Bill No. 745, was received by the Baord. The order in substance allows the Board of County Commissioners the privilege of issuing its warrant , chargeable to its General Fund and to its Poor Fund, to December 31, 193 in amounts equal to its anticipated revenue. from whatever source derived. 31, 1933,

In conformity with this order the Board allowed claims for services rendered and materials purchased subsequent to April, 30, 1933.

On motin of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy the Board adjourned to meet June 7, 1933.

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner X. J. Kennedy

WHEREAS as directed by and in harmony with House Bill No. 745, duly enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, at its 1933 Session, The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, having complied with all the provisions of said act. all of which by the duly certified transcriptof said proceedings, reference being had thereto will more fully and at large appear, and to carry said law into effect and such indobtedness of said county as is con-templated by said act, with interest to July 1, 1933; that the bonds of said County of Douglasissue in the sum hereinafter mentioned; and

WHEREAS such indebtedness of Douglas Counyu, Kansas, on and including April 30, 1933, with interest computed thereon to July 1, 1933, amounts to \$42,342.05.

NOW, THEREPORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County ,Kansas, that funding bond bearing date of Julyl, 1933, in said amount, beissued, bearing interest at 4 and 3/4 %; that each of said bonds and all coupons attached thereto shall bear the facsimile signature of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk; that the total number of said bonds shall be 84, and shall mature serially as follows, to-wit:
