COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION FOR THE YEAR 1933.

The County Board of Equalization met in annual session this 15 th day of May, 1933, for purposes as required by statute. The Board was in session daily from May 15, 1933, to May 25, 1933, inclusive, Sunday excepted. The Boards action on complaints are as follows.

Fannie Sanders 1316 Tenn. granted exemption of \$200.
Petition of Safeway Stores, denied. The Crown Drug Store assessment on schedule 23a was reduced to \$4660. The valuation of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 42, Vt. St, was fixed at \$940; lot 44 Vt. St.. \$4160; the improvements on the same at \$10,500.
Lot 52, Vt., St., value of 1933 assessment fixed at \$1500.
Application of A. G. Welch for reduction in personal valuation, Denied
Application of P. A. Diel for reduction of car value, Denied
C. B. Hosford, R. C. Rankin, D. M. Horkmans, and I. C. Stevenson, representing the Fraternities and Sororities appeared before the Board seeking an adjustment of valuations on the aforesaid properties. Inasmuch as the assessments of the properties for 1930 had not been before this Board for equalization due to injunction proceedings filed by the owners of these proerties, the Board, in conjunction with the aforesaid committee, reviewed the valuations of 1930. The action of the Board is recorded on the assessment rolls for 1930, and extended, in accordance with reductions made by the State Tax Commission for 1931, 1932, 1933. The close of the ten day session having arrived the Board, on motion by X. J. Kennedy seconded by James F. Brass, adjourned to meet in a three day session on June 5, 1933.

June 5, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment taken on the 25th day of May, 1933, the County Board of Equalization met this 5th day of June, 1933, in the three day session as required by law. No complaints or objections to the Boards actions taken during the ten day session were made, and this, the 7th day of June, 1933, being the last day of this three day session, the minutes of the meeting of the County Board of Equalization for the year 1933, were read and approved. Pursuant to adjournment taken on July 5, the Board met this 8 day of July, 1933, in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. Additional claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

A delegation from the Farm Bureau Organization appeared before the Board in behalf their budget for the year of 1934, which calls for a tax levy to raise \$1900.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board adjourned to meet July 12, 1933.

July 12, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment had on July 8, the Board of County Commissioners met this 12 day of July in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing June claims at this meeting.

The formation of a budget for year 1934 and the requirements of the several county funds for the remainder of the present year was dicussed by the Board, and the clerk was requested to furnish the Board information relative to the condition of funds at their next meeting.
