The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of August with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The minutes of the Board's meetings held July 3 - 5 - 8 - 12 and 31, were read and approved.

August 12, 1933.

Pursuant to adjournment taken on August 9, 1933, the Board of County Commissioners met this 12 day of August, 1933, in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board completed the allowing claims at this meeting. No further business of record was transacted at this meeting. On motion properly made and seconded, the Board adjourned to August 14, 1933.

August 14, 1933

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session pursuant to adjournment of August 12, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

This being the day set for a hearing on the County Budget, and the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. having arrived, the budget was presented and discussed at length. Owing to the fact that the County Poor Fund was raised considerably over the amount levied for last year, considerable discussion was had on this phase of budget. No workable suggestion was made as to how this part of the budget might be lowered and still meet the conditions for the coming year. A motion was carried suggesting the the Farm Bureau appropriation be limited to the statutory amount.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session pursuant to adjournment of August 14, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The matter of selecting a County Poor Commissioner and Relief Case Worker to comply with the Federal Emergency Relief Act, and the local county relief committee having examined the applicants for this position, and having recommended Mary Elizabeth Jameson for this, the Board of County Commissioners on Motion of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, The Board appointed Miss Jameson to this position at a salary of \$125 dollars per month, beginning Sept. 1, 1933

On motion of Mr Kennedy, Seconded by Mr. Brass, the following resolution fixing the tax levies for the year 1933, was unanimously adopted.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Douglas County, Kansas, in adjourned regular session this 16 day of August, 1933, that, for the purpose of raising revenue to defray the expenses of the county, and to pay Bonds and interest that are a direct obligation on the county, there be, and is hereby levied on all the taxable property subject thereto the following rates of taxation expressed in mills and fractions thereof.
