

# COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

WHEREAS, it is provided in said law that the Board of Commissioners shall for any County Official receiving public moneys, provide by resolution for the deposit of all public money in one or more banks to be designated and located in said county.

NOW, THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County in regular meeting assembled this 9 day of September, 1933, that the following banks be and are hereby designated as depositories for public money, the amount of which for each bank is not to be exceeded for such bank as is set out opposite the name of such bank as follows, to-wit:

First National Bank	\$101,528.69
Lawrence National Bank	120,461.42
Peoples State Bank	119,211.45
First Savings Bank, Lawrence	11,433.06
Baldwin State Bank	35,217.23
Kaw Valley State Bank, Eudora	16,088.62
State Bank of LeCompton	13,141.00
Lone Star State Bank	3,547.23

That Said Banks shall be deemed as depositories when they shall comply with Chapter 162 of the Session Laws of Kansas for 1933, by filing in the manner provided by law a good and sufficient bond in a sum double the amount which may be on deposit in any one time, if a personal bond, or a bond of some surety company authorized to do business in the state of Kansas, in a sum aggregating the amount which may be on deposit at any one time, conditioned that such deposit shall be promptly paid on the check or draft of the proper authority of the municipality making such deposit; PROVIDED, that in lieu of the giving of such bond, said depository bank, banks or trust companies may deposit with the governing body of the municipality making such deposits security to the amount of seventy per cent (70%) of the amount which may be on deposit therein by said municipality at any one time, which security so deposited shall consist of bonds of the United States of America, the State of Kansas, or of any municipality therein, and first mortgages upon real estate located within the State of Kansas, which mortgages shall be approved and appraised by the bank commissioner of the State of Kansas before they shall be accepted for such purpose: PROVIDED, That such mortgages shall be accepted at such appraisal for not more than one-half of the security required hereunder, at the option of the depository bank. All bonds and mortgages under this section of this act shall be deposited and held as provided in section 9-142 of the Revised Statutes Supplement of 1931 and amendments thereto.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board by unanimes vote authorized the County Clerk to prepare have printed a special warrant to be used in payment of Federal Emergency Relief Pay Rolls, said warrants to be issued by order of the Board of County Commissioners, and signed by the County Clerk.

The question of an assessment against Lot 1, Block 1, West Hills, on account of improvement of West Hills Terrace Road, came before the Board for consideration, and on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board unanimously adopted the following resolution.

## RESOLUTION LEVYING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT

Whereas, a petition was filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, August 5, 1931, and in accordance with the provisions of law as set forth in section 68-728, 1930 Supplement to the Revised Statutes of Kansas, 1923, praying for the improvement of certain roads in Douglas County, Kansas, named and fully described in said petition as Stratford Road, West Hills Parkway, and West Hills Terrace.

Whereas, said petition was favorably considered by the Board of County Commissioners at a regular meeting held August 8, 1931, and the Board did then set September 17, 1931, as the time for final hearing on said petition, such notice being published in the Official County Paper for three consecutive weeks, beginning August 13, 1931.
