

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

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November 18, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment of November 10, the Board met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners and the County Clerk present. The allowing of claims was completed for this month.

Bids for furnishing gasoline for county use were opened by the Board and the contract was awarded to the Sinclair Refining Co. for one year.

The application of Mrs. Ivy Brown for a Mother's Pension came before the Board for consideration, and in compliance with the statutes governing the same the Board appointed an investigating committee composed of the following named persons: Mrs. E. F. Abels, Mrs. Seba Eldrige, and Mrs. W. O. Hamilton.

On motion by James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, the regular session for November was adjourned.

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November 18, 1933.

On call of the Chairman, the Board of County Commissioners met in special session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

This meeting was called for the purpose of providing means to comply with the Federal Civil Works program which goes in effect November 19, 1933.

The County Engineer reported a shortage of small tools (picks, shovels, ect.) and the need of at least two 1½ ton trucks. On motion made and seconded, the authorized the County Engineer to purchase such tools as was needed, and to purchase two 1½ ton Ford trucks, one from the Hamilton Motor Co., of Lawrence, and one from the Smih Motor Co., of Baldwin at \$910.00 each.

On motion of Kennedy, seconded by Brass, the meeting was adjourned.

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The Board of County Commissioners and the County Engineer were called to Topeka on this date to meet with the State Highway Commission for the purpose of discussing the Civil Works Program as formulated by the Federal Government.
