The Township Board of Eudora and Palmyra Townships and other interested persons met with the Board of County Commissioners to discuss the proposal to construct one mile of road on the Eudora-Township line, between section 10 and 15, T14S, R21E. This being a Township road, and the cost of Building it would be more than the township funds could bear at this time, no provision having been made for this added expense in their respective budgets. It was the decision of the Boards present that this work should not be undertaken at this time. The Board of County Commissioners assured the Township Boards, that whenever the Townships were financially able to construct a proper road at the above designated place, the County would construct suitable bridges to complete the work.

The Lathrop Road in Palmyra Township came before the Board for consideration, and as this is Township project, and the Palmyra Township showed to the County Board that the Township could not bear this expense this year, it was unanimously agreed that this work should be deferred.

In order to comply with the Civil Works Program and hold the allowance of Federal funds to Douglas County, it was found necessary to purchase a rock crusher, and on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, a 9 by 18 Rogers Crusher was purchased for the sum of \$1503.00 to be paid from the Bridge Fund

On motion of James H. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, the Board adjourned to Dec. 5, 1933/

December 5, 1933

Pursuant to adjournment taken December 4, the Board of County Commissioners this 5th day of December, 1933, in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present/.

The Board spent the forenoon in auditing and allowing claim and transacting routine business. In the afternoon, the Board with the County Engineer inspected the work being done on the Stull Road and made preparation to open a rock quarry on the Leocompton-Lakeview road as a civil works project.

On motion adjournment was taken to December 6.

December 6, 1933

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Willow Springs Township Board accompanied by a considerable delegation came before the Board to discuss the probability of road work being done in the township. The Civil Works Program was explained to the group as to what would be necessary for the Township to sponsor a federal Project under the Civil Works program. Mr. Flora, the Trustee, expressed the opinion that the was not prepared to meet the requirements with the necessary equipment and expense.

The Clinton Township Board, represented by Mr. Sutton and Mr. Flory, discussed with the Commissioners certain contemplated road work in their Township. The Board of County Commissioners set Wednesday Dec. 13, at 2 o'clock P. M. as the time to view the work.

The application of Harry Howard for the remission of the balance of his fine in the amount of \$36 be remitted. came before the Board for consideration. It was found that Harry Howard had been fine \$100 and sentenced to 30 days in jail for liquor law violation, and that he had served his sentence and worked out \$64 of his, and that there was likelihood of his being employed whereby he could support his family on being released, the Board by unanimous vote remitted the balance of said fine in the amount of \$36.

On motion the Board Adjourned to Dec, 8, 1933

December 8, 1933

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present, Claims against the County were audited and allowed by the Board as per register.

The Board directed the County Clerk to instruct the County Treasurer to transfer from the Special Bridge Fund \$2000.00, crediting the County Road Fund with \$500.00, and the County Bridge Fund with \$1500.00. also, to instruct the County Treasurer to transfer from the County-Township Road Fund to the County Road Fund the sum of \$5346.66. this being the county's share of the State Gasoline tax

On motion the Board adjourned to December 9, 1933

The Tanwaka Township Board and other interested parties appeared before the Board of Commissioners to discuss the road petitioned for by Fred Gregory. It was the consensus of opinion that this road should not be opened at this time.
