The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County clerk present.

The petition of H. D. Brecheisen and others, asking the the County Commissioners add to the County Road System certain roads described in said petition came before the Board for consideration. The petition was referred to the County Engineer for the purpose of checking the names of the signers

By unanimous vote the Board of County Commissioners decided to make application to the State Tax Commission for a suspension of the operation of the Cash Basis Law until January 1, 1935. This procedure was deemed necessary owing to the inability of taxpayers to meet their taxes promptly.

The Commissioners, the County Engineer and the Poor Commissioner spent considerable time in checking over Civil Works Projects in the County.

On motion of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, and by unanimous vote the following resolution was adopted:-

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 22, Chapter 186, Session Laws of Kansas, for 1933, that whenever the amount allowed by this act for clerical hire in any county office shall be insufficient to properly and efficiently do the work of the office, then the Board of County Commissioners may, by resolution published once in the official county paper, provide funds to properly and efficiently do the work of the office, or offices. And,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners find that the amount allowed by this Act for clerk hire in the office of County Treasurer and in the office of County Clerk is not sufficient to properly and efficiently do the work of said offices.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Douglas County, in regular session assembled this 21st, day of December, 1933, that there is hereby allowed for the fiscal year 1934 the sum of \$3500.00 for the office of the County Treasurer, and the sum of \$1800.00 for the office of the County Clerk.
