The following communication was received by the Board:

Board of County Commissioners,
Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas.

Gentlemen:

In reference to the position of constable of Lawrence Township, be advised that Theodore Charlton told me about a week ago that he had moved his residence from this county and that he considered that he had vacated the office, and that it would be proper to appoint a successor.

You are therefore advised that the position of constable in Lawrence Township has been vacated, and that your Board may legally fill the same

Following the above advice, and on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board adopted by unanimous vote the following resolution.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, It has been shown to the Board of County Commissioners, that Theodore S. Charlton, a duly elected and qualified constable in and for the City of Lawrence, a second class city in Douglas County, Kansas, has moved from this Jurisdiction, with no immediate intention of returning thereto, And,

WHEREAS, There is need in the City of Lawrence of two qualified and acting constables, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled this 21st day of December, 1933, that the office of constable held by Theodore S. Charlton, be and is hereby declared vacant. And,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by this Board of County Commissioners, that Geo. S. Smith, whose address is 742 N. 5th St., Lawrence, Kansas, be and is hereby appointed to fill this vacancy in the office of constable in and for the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, until the next General Election, and that this appointment shall be in effect on and after said Geo. S. Smith shall have qualified and filed his as required by law.
