The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the <sup>month</sup> of January with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Black, that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the payment of Twenty (\$20) Dollars per month out of the County Farm and Poor Fund to Mrs Ivy Brown to assist her in caring for an indigent son, said amount to be paid monthly, and until discontinued or modified by the Board of County Commissioners. The motion was unanimously carried.
