

# COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

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February 10, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session this 10th day of February, 1934, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board was occupied during the day in auditing and allowing claims against the county for services and materials furnished during the month of January, No other business of record was transacted at this meeting.

On motion of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, the Board adjourned to February 14, 1934

February 14, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met this 14th day of February, 1934, in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The governing body of the city of Lawrence met with the Board of County Commissioners to discuss the petition for paving Barker Avenue, a street forming the boundary line between the City of Lawrence and Wakarusa Township, from fifteenth street to nineteenth street. The City Commission also discussed with the Board the advisability of annexing certain territory on Barker Avenue to the City of Lawrence. No action was taken by the Board of County Commissioners on either of the above proposals at this meeting

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board adjourned to February 21, 1934

February 21, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

On the proposal of the City Commission of the city of Lawrence to pave Barker Avenue from 15th Street to 19th Street, the Board of County Commissioners, on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, voted unanimously not to enter into a joint contract with the City of Lawrence for the pavement of Barker Avenue at this time.

The Board together with the County Engineer inspected the Harrison rock quarry, and found the work progressing satisfactorily.

The County Clerk was instructed to notify the newspapers of Douglas County that the Board will designate an official paper for the ensuing year at their regular meeting March 5, 1934. All proposals shall state the price per 250 tons for first and subsequent, All proposal shall be filed with the County Clerk not later than ten o'clock A. M. March 5, 1934.

On motion the February regular session was adjourned
