

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

May 16, 1934

Pursuant to adjournment taken on May 12, the Board of County Commissioners met this 16th day of May, 1934, in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board completed the allowing of claims for this session. No other business of record was transacted at this meeting, and on motion of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy the Board adjourned the regular May session.

The minutes of the meetings of the Board of County Commissioners held during the month of May, 1934, were read and Approved as Council below this 2 day of June, 1934.

May 18, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. The Board of County Commissioners, together with the County Engineer, made an inspection of all bridges across the Wakarusa Creek west from U.S. Highway 73 E to the west county line.

Claims against the county were allowed as per allowance Register. On motion the Board adjourned to meet to May 9, 1934.

COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.  
May 21, 1934

The County Board of Equalization for the year 1934, met in annual session this 21st day of May, 1934, with the members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely, Earl T. Black, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, as the Board of Equalization, and County Clerk, as clerk. The Board was in daily session from May 21 to and including June 1, except on May 27, Sunday; and May 30, Decoration Day.

All adjustments of individual complaints made by the Board are recorded on the Assessment rolls in red ink, showing the adjustment on land and improvements separately.

All adjustments of individual valuations having been made, the Board considered the relative valuations of the several taxing districts of the county. Upon full investigation the Board found and determined that the assessed valuation of the real estate in Eudora City was 20% too high and that the assessed valuation of lands and lots within the corporate limits of the City of Lawrence were 10% too high, and on motion made and unanimously carried, the Board ordered a reduction of 20% on the equalized valuation of all real estate values in Eudora City, and a reduction of 10% on the equalized valuation on lands and lots within the corporate limits of the City of Lawrence, and the County Clerk is hereby directed to make such reductions on the assessment rolls of Douglas County.

The ten day session for hearing complaints having expired the Board adjourned as required by statute to meet on June 12, 1934.

June 12, 1934.

The County Board of Equalization met this 12th day of June, 1934, in a three day session for the purpose of hearing complaints of persons whose valuations as fixed by the Deputy Assessors were raised by this Board during its ten day session. No complaints having been made, the Board completed its work and adjourned sine die this 14th day of June, 1934.
