

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

July 2, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of July, Earl T. Black Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

The minutes of the meeting held on June 4-6-9-13 were read and approved. The Board spent the day in allowing claims against the County for services and material rendered during the month of June.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet July 3, 1934.

July 3, 1934

Pursuant to adjournment taken on July 2, 1934, the Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. Additional claims against the county were audited and allowed as per allowance register.

The Board instructed the County Engineer to ask for bids on a car load of lumber from the local dealers. The bids to be opened July 11, 1934 at 2 o'clock P. M.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet July 7, 1934.

July 7, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session pursuant to adjournment taken July 3, 1934, with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass, Commissioners and the county Clerk present.

The Board completed the allowing of claims filed against the County for the month of June.

The Board by unanimous vote remitted a fine of \$34.20 issued against William Carter for violation of the State Liquor Law.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet July 11, 1934.

July 11, 1934

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session pursuant to adjournment taken July 7, 1934 with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass, Commissioners and the County Clerk Present.

The bids on a car load of Bridge lumber called for on July 3, were presented by the County Engineer, and on examination by the Board it was determined that the Burgner-Bowman-Matthews Lumber Company was found to have the lowest bid on lumber specified and on motion of James P. Brass seconded by X. J. Kennedy this company was awarded the contract for one car load of No. 1 full sawn, common Doyles Fir, bridge lumber, at \$34.00 per thousand board feet, P. O. P., Lawrence, Kansas.

The Board completed the allowing of claims for the month of June.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy seconded by James P. Brass the regular session for the month of July was adjourned.

## SPECIAL MEETING

July 21, 1934

On call of the chairman a special meeting was held on the above date for the purpose of taking action on matters in connection with Kansas Emergency Relief. Present at this meeting, Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass Commissioners, and the Deputy County Clerk.

The question of water supply and water conservation came before the Board for consideration.

The Board approved a water project of thirty wells to be dug in the County and to supply the necessary equipment in accordance with K.E.R.C regulations.

The appointment of the following persons for positions in connection with K.E.R.C Work in Douglas County was approved by the Board:

On motion of X. J. Kennedy seconded by James P. Brass the Board authorized the purchase of a pump, pipe and tank for use at the Lecompton Emergency well.

On motion of James P. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy the Board adjourned.
