The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, being in regular session this 6th day of August 1934, the matter of issuing Emergency Relief Bonds came before the Board for consideration. On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James P. Brass, the Board addressed a formal application to the State Tax Commission for approval of such issue of bonds, a copy of which application is attached to and made a part of this transcript.

WHEREAS:

It now appears to the Board of County Commissioners that the tax levies they are authorized and empowered by Statute to make for the relief of the poor will not, if levied in the maximum, produce sufficient revenue for the care and maintenance of the poor who are dependent upon the public for support during the fiscal year ensuing after such levies are made, and,

WHEREAS:

It appears to the Board of County Commissioners that additional revenue will be needed for the relief of the poor and destitute and that it will therefore be necessary to issue bonds as provided in Chapter 67 of Session Laws of 1933.

WHEREAS:

Douglas County, Kansas is a county having a population of not less than 25,000 and not more than 30,000.

NOW THEREFORE:

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas makes application to this Honorable Commission for permission to issue bonds provided by Chapter 67, Session Laws of 1933, for counties having a population as aforesaid, said bond issue not to exceed \$30,000.
