

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

August 11, 1934.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board completed the allowing of claims against the County for the month of July.

The Board together with the engineer inspected proposed sites for the drilling of wells and building ponds.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet, August 15, 1934.

STATE TAX COMMISSION
August 13, 1934

The County of Douglas by its Board of County Commissioners having made application to the State Tax Commission for authority to issue not to exceed \$30,000 in Emergency Relief Bonds to cover the deficit in the County Farm and Poor Fund for the present year 1934, the State Tax Commission notified the Board of County Commissioners that a hearing on said application would be held before the State Tax Commission on ^{Aug.} July 13, 1934.

In accordance with said notice Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass, Commissioners, C. O. Bowman, County Clerk and Mildred LeSuer, appeared at the hearing and presented evidence of the need of such bond issue. whereupon the State Tax Commission issued their granting the application.

August 15, 1934.

Pursuant to adjournment taken August 11, the Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James P. Brass Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

This being the day advertised for a public hearing on the proposed budget for 1934, and the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. having arrived, the Chairman, Earl T. Black called the meeting to Order. Twenty five or thirty interested persons being present.

The items included in the budget were taken up separately and discussed by the Board and several persons in the audience. After a full discussion had been had and on motion of James P. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy the budget as read was adopted.

The petition of Mrs Raymond Carr for a Mother's Aid Pension was presented to the Board, and in accordance with law, the following named persons were appointed as an investigating committee; Mrs. J. A. Benson, 1010 Ky. St.; Mrs. W. P. Kopp, 2141 Mass. St. and Mrs O. A. McGinnis 728 Elm St.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James P. Brass, the application of Mrs. Grace S. Black for admission to the State Sanatorium for Tuberculosis, Norton, Kansas, at county expense was approved.

It was moved by X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James P. Brass to recommend to the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee an increase in pay for Mrs. Hedwig Thaxter from \$13.50 per week to \$17.50 per week. The motion was carried.

It was moved by J. P. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy, to appoint Mrs. Grace Williams, as Assistant Case Supervisor and recommend the payment \$50.00 per month out of K.E.R.C. funds in addition to \$50.00 per month paid out of County Poor fund. The motion was carried.

The Board directed the minutes of August 15, 1933 to be supplemented by a record of the approved and employment of a County Poor Commissioner and Relief Case Worker to comply with the Federal Law. Such addition is attached to page 126 of the Commissioners Record, Book M.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet August 23, 1934.
