

AUGUST 13, 1934

The County of Douglas, by its Board of County Commissioners, having made application to the State Tax Commission for authority to issue not to exceed \$30,000 Emergency Relief Bonds, the State Tax Commission notified the Board of County Commissioners that a hearing on said application would be held in Topeka, at 10 o'clock A. M. August 13, 1934.

In accordance with this notice the Board of County Commissioners, Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk appeared at the hearing and presented evidence of the need for such issue of bonds. Whereupon, the State Tax Commission issued their order granting the application, a copy of said order being attached to and made a part of this transcript.

BEFORE THE STATE TAX COMMISSION.

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, FOR APPROVAL OF THE STATE TAX COMMISSION OF ITS ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$30,000, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 67 OF THE LAWS OF KANSAS, SPECIAL SESSION OF 1933.

ORDER

Now, upon this 13th day of August, 1934, comes on for hearing, before the State Tax Commission of Kansas, the application of Douglas County, Kansas, for an order approving its issuance of poor relief bonds, under Chapter 67 of the Laws of Kansas, Special Session of 1933, in the sum of \$30,000; said county being represented by its Board of County Commissioners and County Clerk.

Said county having introduced its evidence in support of said application, it is hereby found that the facts and allegations set forth in said application are true; that it is necessary that said bonds be issued to provide funds for the relief of the poor and destitute of said county.

Now therefore, it is hereby considered, ordered and decreed, by the State Tax Commission, that the issuance of said Bonds by said county be and they are hereby approved, same to be issued and money expended under the provisions of said Chapter 67 of the Laws of Kansas, Special Session of 1933.
