The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present.

The Board completed the allowing of claims for services rendered and material purchased during the month of August.

On bids previously submitted the board on motion of James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy authorized the County Engineer to purchase two car loads of bridge lumber of the Wheeler Lumber Co. Omaha Nebraska, at \$32.50 per thousand feet.

In accordance with K.E.R.C. Form 74 and on motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by James F. Brass, the Board of County Commissioners approved the appointment of Charles Wright Gates, as accountant at \$21.00 per week to be paid out of K.E.R.C. Funds.

In accordance with a published notice for bids on county coal, sitting Sept. 12, at 11 o'clock A. M. for considering coal bids, the Board opened all bids filed with the County Clerk, but not finding any bid satisfactory, did on motion by James F. Brass, seconded by X. J. Kennedy reject all bids, and directed the County Clerk to notify, by mail, coal dealers that the Board would receive bids for coal up to noon Sept. 19, 1934.
