Plans and estimates for permanent repair of the Kansas River Figns and estimates for permanent repair of the Kansas River Bridge at Budora were presented by the Engineers. A full discussion of the work to be done developed the fact that neither Douglas Gounty, nor Leaven-worth County had mifficient funds symilable to do this work in a satis-factory manner. It was then decided that if possible, authority to issue warrants for the necessary funds be sought through the State Tax commission.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with Earl T. Black, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy, Commissioners, and the County Clerk present. Commissioner James F. Brass being absent.

On motion of X. J. Kennedy, seconded by Earl T. Black, the contract for 200 tons, more or less, of Southern Kansas Coal shipped from Pontiac, was awarded the Lawrence Mill and Elevator Co. at \$4.65 mine weight, F.O.B. tracks

By resolution on K.E.R.C. form No. 74, the Board approved the following appointments to the Poor Commissioners staff to be paid out of Federal Allotment Funds, Chester Wright Gates, accountant, at the salary of \$21.00 per week, James R. Wiggins, Cattle Carctaker, at the Salary of \$30.00 per week.

The following resolution was adoptedby the Board of County Commissioners:

RESOLUTION

Providing for the employment of and prescribing the compensation of certain employees in the office of the County Poor Commissioner of Douglas County,

Whereas, the proper administration of relief in Douglas County requires much work on the part of the County Poor Commissionery, and

Whereas, there is need and will be need for the employment of stenographers clerks, accountants, book-keepers, chauffeurs, and other employees in the effice of the County Poor Commissioner for the proper administration of relief, and

Whereas, the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee will, under certain conditions and for certain purposes pay a part of the compensation of such employees

Whereas, the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee requires certain qualifications in such employments, now therefore,

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in session assembled:

That whenever the County Poor Commissioner of Douglas County is of the That whenever the County Poor Commissioner of Douglas County is of the opinion that it is advisable and necessary to employ stenographic, clerical, accounting, or other help in the office of the County Poor Commissioner, he shall recommend to the Board of County Commissioners persons whom he believes are competent and qualified and who have been approved by the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee for employment in the County Poor Commissioner's office. Such recommend ation shall include a recommendation of the compensation to be paid such person. Unthorgengele Help Poor Commune Such reccommend.

That if the Board of County Commissioners is of the opinion that the employment is necessary to the proper and adequate administration of relief, it may by resolution employ such person, and if any of the compensation of such employee is to be paid by the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee a certified copy of the resolution of employment shall be forwarded to the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee. The employee shall receive on week's vacation with pay for each six months of completed service, provided vacation time by be accumulated beginning at the conclusion of the first six months; and if the employment is such that transportation is necessary in the employment, the county will furnish transportation for authorized travel or will allow five cents the mile for authorized automobile transportation and the necessary cost of other authorized transportation.
