Uon the 27th day of October, 1934, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met in regular session (special session pursuant to lawful and proper cell by the chairman on the request of Commissioner Kennedy and Commissioner Brass), there being present Earl T. "RESOLUTION IN SUBSTITUTION OF PORTIONS OF RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY KANSAS ADOPTED UPON THE 6th DAY OF AUGUST, 1934 AND ON THE LOTH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1934, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE BY DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS OF BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$30,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE RELIEF OF THE POOR.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, did heretofore upon the 6th day of August, 1934 and upon the 10th day of October, 1934 adopt resolutions relating to the authorizing the issuance by said county of bonds in the sum of \$30,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds for the relief of the poor of said county, pursuant to authority granted by the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Laws of Kansas of the Special Session of 1933; and
