# JANUARY 7, 1935

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of January, with two members, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass and the County Clerk present.

Mr. X. J. Kennedy a member of this Board, was suddenly stricken with a serious illness on the night of December 27, and died within a few minutes after becoming ill. Mr. Kennedy was a member of this Board nearly 12 years, his term expiring on Jan. 14, 1935.

The two members of the Board, Harl T. Black and James F. Brass, and County Clerk C. O. Bowman, testify to the sterling work of X. J. Kennedy, as a public official. Owing to the fact of the few days between the desth of Mr. Kennedy and the time for the newly elected commissioner to take office it was decided by the Board and the County Clerk that no appointment would be made to fill the vacancy, but to transact only routine business.

No business of record, other than allowing approved claims for services rendered and materials: furnished the county during Becember, as per allowance record.
