

A motion was moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schanke that the county refund to the KERC a two per cent discount taken by Douglas County on Kansas City Pump Company, invoices No. 3054 and No. 3069 to the amount of \$61.09. This motion was voted and the bill ordered paid.

Amount for new Project

By unanimous vote of the Commissioners it was ordered that the County Contribution up to eleven hundred dollars if necessary be allowed for additional wiring of the Court House in connection with the KERC renovation project. This is in addition to the amount contemplated for wiring as specified in the KERC specifications.

By vote of the Board E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer, was authorized to install a blue print set-up in his department for map printing purposes.

A motion was moved and seconded and properly voted that the Board approve the bond of L. L. O'Mera and Ralph Coleman in connection with the road petition of L.L. O'Mera and fifteen others petitioning for certain road improvements and that the bonds of Otto L. Johannig and Arthur Hird be likewise approved on their petition signed by Otto L. Johannig and thirteen others.

Official Bond

The bonds of the elected officials of both County and Townships were again checked and approved with the exception of the bonds of John Callahan, District Clerk, and Frank Topping, Treasurer of Wakarusa Township. John Callahan was asked to have his bond of \$2000.00 raised to \$4000.00, and Frank Topping was asked to have his bond of \$4000.00 raised to \$6000.00. Both of these men had filed bonds written by Bonding Surety Companies. The request for the raise was approved by the three members of the Board.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 o'clock on the morning of February 11, 1935.
