The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kans. met in regular adjourned session on this 6th day of April, 1935, with James F. Brass, Chairman, Earl T. Black and Chris Schaaque, Commissioners, and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk present.

WHEREUPON, it was moved by Commissioner Chris Schaaque and seconded by Commissioner Earl T. Black that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners find that the combined tax levies of one mill for County Poor Fund and five-eighths mill for the Emergency Poor Relief fund will not be sufficient to meet the necessary expenditures for the year of 1935, the Emergency Relief Fund being already depleted, and,

Whereas, under Section 2, House Bill 427, Session Laws of 1935 it is provided that the county may issue bonds for the relief of the poor not exceeding 1/3 of one per cent of the County's assessed valuation,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in adjourned regular session this 6th day of April, 1935, that the Board draw a Resolution for the issuance of Bonds for the Relief of the Poor and present it with a formal application to the State Tax Commission for authority to issue Bonds as provided in Section 2 of House Bill No. 427, Session of 1935.

WHEREAS, under section 2, House Bill 427, Session Laws of 1935, it is provided that the County may issue bonds for the relief of the poor not exceeding 1/3 of 1 per cent of said assessed valuation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in adjourned regular session this 6th day of April, 1935, that pursuant to House Bill 427, the County of Douglas issue bonds in the sum of not to exceed FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, (\$50,000) the same to mature in equal amounts each year for a period not exceeding ten years, the said County to annually make a levy covering the interest accruing and the bonds maturing during the next budget year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this proposal to issue bonds be submitted to the State Tax Commission of the State of Kansas, for their approval.
