At the request of the Chairman of the Board, Dr. Will Gorrill and A. R. Kennedy, dentist, met with the Board in conciltation on the Board's proposition relative to fees for the extracting of teeth, namely \$1.00 for the first tooth extracted and fifty cents for each tooth extracted thereafter in any one sitting. The doctors agreed for themselves to accept the fee scale as set for by the Board.

Mr. Lutz, Mr. Metsker, and Mr. Burton appeared before the Board in the interest of certain citizens in Marion Township relative to the straightening of the Range Line County Road. Their nequest was taken under advisement.

Representatives of Herman Transmeier of Overbrook, Kansas; but whose home is in Douglas County appeared before the Board asking that the Board pay the expense of hospitalization in Bell Memorial Hospital for the said Herman Transmeier. They represented that he is to undergo an operation for cataracts of the eyes. The Board agreed to pay fifty per cent of the hospitalization expenses including anesthetics and operating room.
