

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

April 22, 1935

*Gowan tract*

The Board of County Commissioners met in the chambers of the Board with all the members of the Board of Commissioners and County Clerk present. The meeting was held pursuant to a postponement as recorded in the Commissioner's Records as of and under date April 1, 1935, at which time a petition from the City of Lawrence was being considered. In its petition, the City of Lawrence asked the Board of County Commissioners to make a finding as to the advisability of adding a certain tract of land known as the "Gowan" tract to the City of Lawrence. At the April 1 meeting the Board of County Commissioners, at the request of Counsel for the Gowan Interests, granted a postponement of the hearing to allow Counsel time for communicating with parties interested in the Gowan Estate. At today's hearing, City Attorney Geo. K. Melvin, representing the City, Raymond Rice, representing the Gowan Interests, and County Attorney R. B. Stevens, for the County, deliberated further on the application and presented arguments to the Board of County Commissioners. That the property in question is now entirely surrounded by City property was conceded by all persons present, and that it was very desirable for reasons that this property should be within the Corporate limits was stressed. After a full presentation by the attorneys present, the following motion was presented: Moved by Chris Schaeke and seconded by Earl T. Black that the property described as beginning at a point 12 feet west of the center line of Indiana Street in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, and on the North line of University Place, and addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas; thence North Three Hundred Seventy Three and Fifty Four Hundredths (373.54) feet; then West Eleven Hundred Seventy Nine (1179) feet; thence South Three Hundred Seventy Three and Fifty Four Hundredths (373.54) feet; thence East Eleven Hundred Seventy Nine (1179) feet to the point of beginning, and containing Ten and Two Tenths (10.2) acres more or less, in Douglas County, Kansas, be taken into and within the boundaries of the City of Lawrence. The motion was put by Chairman James F. Brass and all the Commissioners voted aye on the motion.

*Venetian Blinds*

The Board having disposed of the business for which postponement had been taken, considered other matters of importance to the Board.

Alex. Ramsey, representing J. D. Seiler of the Venetian Blind Company of Chicago, and a J. E. Price, representing the local firm of "Weavers", presented bids for their respective firms for Venetian Blinds for the County Court House. The bid submitted by Alex. Ramsey for his house was \$439.94 for 41 openings, and the bid of J. E. Price, representing "Weavers", was \$379.00 for 39 openings. The bids were taken under advisement.

In the case of Susie F. Davis, who had petitioned for admittance to the State Sanatorium for Tuberculosis at Norton, Kansas, and whose petition had been referred to the Poor Commissioner for investigation and which had been reported back to the Board by her with favorable recommendation, it was voted by the Board that she be sent to the hospital under the usual conditions admitting patients to Norton.

## RESOLUTION (1)

WHEREAS, surveys, plans, and applications for Emergency Bonds have been made and approved, and

WHEREAS, \$60.80 in truck service is required to complete the approved projects, and

WHEREAS, said application has been approved by the Douglas County Relief Committee, and

WHEREAS, application for Amend. #9 to Project 16-E10-17 has been made,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas in regular session assembled:

That \$60.80 be allocated from Douglas County material fund allotment for said truck service subject to the approval of K. E. R. C.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas in regular session assembled:

That \$422.90 be allocated from Douglas County material fund allotment for said rock and truck service as applied for in Amend. #10. Project 16-B2-4 subject to the approval of K. E. R. C.
