SECTION 5. That all sections of said resolution heretofore adopted upon April 16, 1935 which are not inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution be and are readopted and the same shall stand as originally adopted.

This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and adoption.
