FINANCIAL STATEMENT

I, U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, hereby certify that the total assessed valuation of all taxable property situated in Douglas County, Kansas, as shown by the assessment rolls of said county for the year 1934, is as follows:

I further certify that this issue of \$50,000.00 in Douglas County Public Assistance Fund Bonds represents and includes all of the bonds so far issued by Douglas County, Kansas, under House Bill 427, Legislative Session of 1935. An issue of \$30,000.00 Douglas County Emergency Relief Bonds was made under the Emergency Poor Relief Act, Chapter 67 of the Laws of Kansas, enacted at the December Special Session of the Legislature held in 1933.

NOTICE OF BOND SALE

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, will issue as of May 1, 1935, Public Assistance Fund Bonds in the total sum of \$50,000.00 bearing interest at 2½ per cent per annum. The issue consists of 100 bonds of \$500.00 each and will become due serially over a period of ten years as follows:
