The Road Petition of H. F. Horn of Ottawa, Kansas, was presented. The County Commissioners directed the County Clerk to return the petition to Mr. Horn, asking that the Petitioner's Bond be completed and made to conform to the law governing such bonds.

The County Engineer again called the attention of the Board to status of the L. L. O'Meara Road Petition. The present situation was carefully discussed and concluded with the following motion: Moved that the County Engineer prepare damage claims and vouchers for lands to be taken and other damages sustained because of the widening of the road between sections 31 and 32, 12 and 19; to Edward Shaw \$30.00 for land, moving fences and other damages; to Carl Hird \$30.00 for a strip of land 10' by 80 rods and \$20.00 for moving of the fence and such other damages as he may sustain. This motion was made by Earl Black, seconded by Chris Schaaque, and put by Chairman James F. Brass, all the Commissioners voting aye on the motion.

On motion and vote put by the Chairman, the Board adjourned to meet at 10 A. M. May 11, 1935.

Moved by Chris Schaaque and seconded by Earl T. Black, that the Engineer, E. E. Trueblood, be instructed to secure price quotations for steel and other supplies necessary for the re-construction of the Leonhard Bridge in Grant Township. The motion was presented and voted unanimously.

The Kansas Land Bank of Wichita, Kansas, asked for a refund of \$26.58 taxes under House Bill No. 623 Session Laws of 1935. on S<sub>2</sub> of NE<sub>4</sub> 3--15--20. On motion and vote the refund was ordered.

The usual number of belated bills was presented by the County Clerk, inspected, and ordered paid. Said bills were claims against the County for labor, supplies and relief of the destitute.
