Additional Minute for Meeting of June 14, 1935

H. F. Horn, of Willow Springs Township, presented a petition, properly executed, asking for the location of a road described as follows:

Begin at a point 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet south of the NE cor of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 14-T 15 S-R 19E. Thence East about 300 feet to intersection with U. S. 73W Highway. (Positioned for under 68-117-R. S. of Kansas-1923)

This petition was duly considered and the County Clerk was ordered to make due publication thereof and to notify the said H. F. Horn of the action of the Board.

July 1, 1935

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met in regular session with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

Bills for salaries, wages, and materials for the County, and bills for the maintenance of the destitute were presented, scrutinized, and ordered paid insofar as the Board was able to complete the work in a single day.

The question of increasing pay for Alva Hodges was before the Board, and on motion, with the proper second and all the Commissioners voting "aye", it was ordered that the pay of Alva Hodges be raised from \$115.00 to \$125.00 per month. The Board also voted unanimously to raise the wage scale per hour from 40¢ to 45¢ for L. D. Ice.

The Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 a. m. July 3.
