The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with James F. Brass, Chairman, and Earl T. Black and Chris Schaeke, Commissioners, and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk present.

More bills for salaries, wages, materials for the County, and for funds spent in the relief of the Poor were presented, scrutinized, and ordered paid as per allowance record.

In the case of Alliene Winn, seeking admittance to the State Sanatorium for for Tuberculosis at Horton, Kansas, as a County Case. Her application, having been investigated by the case worker and recommended by Health Officer, H. Penfield Jones, was presented to the Board. Moved by Chris Schaeke and seconded by Earl T. Black that Mrs. Winn be recommended for admission to the hospital on the provision that County pay all expenses of transportation, fee of the examining physician, clothing etc, and \$1.00 per day to the State Sanatorium for her care. This motion was properly placed by the Chairman and voted, all the Commissioners voting in the affirmative.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with James F. Brass, Chairman, Earl T. Black and Chris Schaeke, Commissioners, and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk present.

The final bills for the month for supplies, and maintenance of the Poor were presented and ordered paid as per allowance record. The claim of Bertha Knop for a refund of \$7.28 on refund certificate #996; and a refund to Anna Weed of \$5.31 on her redemption certificate #957 were presented, considered, and ordered paid. A refund warrant was issued to the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company in payment for taxes protested in 1933, based on an excessive valuation of Eudora Township Road levee of .61 mills. This was paid on the State Tax Commissioner's order No. 48 dated April 25, 1935.

The question of the paying of men who did extra duty during the flood season on the Lewis dike was taken up and considered. After discussion, it was agreed that the men who could prove their claims by competent authority would be granted 25¢ per hour for the time devoted to the maintenance of the dike, the same to be paid from the Poor fund.

The County Board, by a proper motion and second and properly voted, authorized the County Clerk and the County Poor Commissioner to rent electric fans for the relief office at the best possible rental price.

The question of the purchase of a mimeographing machine for the County Superintendent of Schools' office was taken up. The County Superintendent presented his choice of machines and the reason for making his choice. His choice was the machine offered by Crane and Company at Topeka. The price net \$175.00. Chris Schaeke moved that the machine be secured, and Earl T. Black seconded this motion.
