The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas met in regular adjourned session with James F. Brass, Chairman, Earl T. Black and Chris Schaake, Commissioners, and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk present.

The usual belated bills for wages, materials, and for the maintenance of the Poor were presented and ordered paid as per allowance record.

Again several committees appeared before the Board with no proposition of record value.

A representative of the Martin Tractor Company of Topeka, Kansas, appeared before the Board to interest the Board in the leasing of two patrols. After considerable discussion, the Douglas County Board of County Commissioners leased from the Martin Tractor Company of Topeka, Kansas, two Diesel Patrols to be put in operation on the road to Douglas County, Kansas, on or about the 1st day of September, 1935. Said patrols are equipped with canopy tops and 14 feet mold boards. They also have dual wheel on the rear and are mechanically controlled. The total lease price agreed upon is \$8660.20 from which price there is deducted a \$1200.00 value of caterpillar patrols which now are of no further value or use to the County and which the Martin Tractor Company accepts as a part of the lease price. The balance of the lease price \$7460.20 is to be paid in monthly installments extending over a period of two years beginning January 1, 1936. The monthly rental price is \$310.84. The first monthly installment is due and payable January 1, 1936, and on the first of each succeeding month thereafter, a like sum shall be paid until the full amount of \$7460.20 shall be paid in 24 installments of \$310.84 each.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet in regular adjourned session on the 14th day of August, 1935.
